2011-2012 School Theme

IN CHRIST ALONE



At FVL, our mission is to provide teens with an excellent Christian education. This includes both encouraging our students to live lives of service and preparing them for eternity. This year's school theme, *In Christ Alone*, serves as the foundation for what we teach, believe and encourage.

The theme comes from the title of Hymn 752 in the Worship Supplement. The words *In Christ Alone* emphasize that no matter what our position is in life and no matter what challenges or struggles we face, our hope is centered solely on our Savior Jesus Christ.

Consider the words of the hymn:

*In Christ Alone, my hope is found,
He is my light, my strength, my song,
This Cornerstone, this solid ground
Firm through the fiercest drought and storm
What heights of love, what depths of peace,
When fears are stilled, when strivings cease,
My Comforter, my All in All;
Here in the love of Christ I stand.*

The Bible text chosen to match this theme is Acts 4:12: *Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.* This passage reminds us of Christ's unique ministry on earth — his suffering, death, and resurrection — that makes him the world's only Savior. Each month focuses on a different aspect of how Jesus has impacted our lives.

- September – *In Christ Alone – I Am*
- October – *In Christ Alone – I Stand*
- November – *Christ Alone – My King*
- December – *Christ Alone – My Savior*
- January – *Christ Alone – My Light*
- February – *Christ Alone – My Life*
- March – *Christ Alone – My Sacrifice*
- April – *Christ Alone – My Resurrection*
- May – *Christ Alone – I Go*

Throughout the school year, our chapel messages, prayers, and the lead article in each *Fox Tracks* newsletter will stress this theme.

Tuition Payments

If you selected the one-pay or two-pay option, the payment is due July 31st.

If you have not received your 2011-2012 bill, please contact the Business Office.

Finances

Operating support from our 41 Federation congregations should meet the adopted commitment of \$840,000. Just over \$100,000 was needed in June and over \$60,000 was received in the first two weeks.

Contributions to *Growing in Grace* debt retirement met the goal of \$300,000 for the year. On March 1, the debt balance was reduced to \$2,990,000.00. The hope is to retire the building debt by 2020 without having any of this cost impact tuition.

SCRIP sales exceeded \$3 million this year. Sixty percent of the profits generated are allocated to tuition for present or future students. Over \$90,000 was deducted from family tuition bills this year. The remainder of the profit, after expenses, was divided between the general Tuition Assistance fund, *Growing in Grace*, and the FVL Foundation for future tuition assistance.

Requests for financial aid continue to increase each year, requiring a renewed emphasis on gifts for the financial aid fund.

FVL's solar panels went into production in the last week of March. Use the link on our web site to track the production of electricity for FVL.

We pray that the Lord will continue to lead many to desire continued Christian education for their youth at FVL.

Online Gradebook

FVL utilizes an online gradebook system for both students and parents. Besides staying current with the student's grades, families are able to access assignment details in "real time," including individual grades for each assessment and missing assignments. Students will utilize their Student Access account, in which they can view their grades, lunch account, and attendance information.

Parents can register for Family Access anytime by contacting the school office. It will be demonstrated at the August 31 Freshmen/New Student Orientation /Meet Your Teachers night. Students will receive information on how the system works on August 25, Orientation Day.

Textbooks

As part of the tuition cost, students are provided with textbooks. Book covers are encouraged to prevent wear and tear. Should students lose or damage textbooks beyond usable condition, they will be charged the invoice cost for replacing them. Students are expected to supply their own Bible and/or Catechism for religion classes. Freshmen are expected to purchase the Concordia Self Study Bible for classroom use. These Bibles are available in the school office for \$40.

Marathon Volunteers

The FVL family has been presented with a few unique opportunities. The Community First Fox Cities Marathon is looking for volunteers at water stations for their Saturday morning training runs and at the Fox Cities Marathon. The Saturday morning water stops require only a few volunteers at each station. FVL's dates are July 2, 16, and 23. Volunteers are asked to arrive at Run Away Shoes in Appleton (W3192 County Road KK) at 6:45 AM for supplies and directions to their location. The time commitment for these days would be no more than three hours. We are responsible for three stations on those dates. A donation of \$540 would be received for our efforts on the training runs.

We are also committed to provide 50 volunteers for the Fox Cities Marathon which will be run on Sunday, September 18th. The Fox Valley Lutheran Athletic Department will receive \$1,000 for our participation. The water station is at the nine mile mark on the marathon course. We will also serve as traffic control for intersections in that area. While many of our track and cross country members will be involved, still other volunteers are needed. If you are not participating in this event, volunteering is a great way to get involved. Fall Tryouts

During the month of August, many athletic teams are chosen. Usually at all three levels, but especially the freshmen level, there are many students who try out. These students come from many grade school programs where they were part of the team. Because of a limited number of students allowed on a roster, only one team at each level, and other factors, cuts have to be made in various sports. For the coaches, this is a time of difficult decision making. For many students, this is the first time that they experience the cutting process from a team, and it can be disheartening and disappointing.

Parents, if your son or daughter is cut from a team, please provide positive support, and remind him or her that there are other school activities that would welcome their participation. They also can utilize the Fitness Center, where they can work out and prepare themselves for other sports.

Finally, remember that being cut is not the end of the world. The situation does offer a tremendous opportunity to learn about dealing with life's challenges in a manner that reflects gratitude for our Savior's love for us.

A sports pass which admits one adult to all home sporting events during the 2011-2012 season is \$40. They may be purchased at home football, volleyball, and basketball games or at wrestling events. Admission to WIAA playoff games hosted at FVL is not included. Single adult tickets are \$4 per event.

Parents also volunteer to run scoreboards, keep score books, or do other duties. Having both faculty and parents involved gives them a chance to meet people and serve their school. Lockers

Locker assignments will be made during orientation. Students need to purchase a school combination lock for their locker if they don't have one from last year. Locks will also have to be purchased for any locker in the physical/athletic area. They are available in the school office for \$5. **All combination locks must be purchased at FVL.**

Orientation Day

All freshmen students must attend the orientation day on August 25 from 8:00 AM to 1:50 PM. All other students are to attend their 1 ½ hour orientation time on that day. The times are posted on the cover page of this *Fox Tracks*. All students will have their picture taken for their school ID. This picture, except for seniors, is also the yearbook picture. Locks and parking permits may be purchased, and money put into lunch accounts. Please mark this date and make sure your student(s) attend.

Frosh/New Student Parent Orientation & Meet the Teachers

Mark your calendar to attend these events on the evening of August 31:

- Freshmen and new parents will meet at 6:00 PM in the auditorium at which time the Parent Handbook will be reviewed, highlighting policies and procedures.
- All parents are invited to attend the Meet the Teachers from 7:00-9:00 PM. Please assemble in the auditorium after picking up your student's schedule in the Commons. You will experience a "mini-school day", meeting each of your student's teachers in the classrooms where you will learn what's happening in their classes. Open gradebook guidelines will also be discussed.

School Planners

All students are required to purchase and use a Student Planner. The \$6 cost is included in the billing statement. It serves in a variety of ways to assist the student with organization skills, and also as the student's hallway pass.

Parking

Students who regularly drive to school need to purchase a \$10 parking permit. Upperclassmen who drive should purchase this permit on Orientation Day. This money assists with parking lot maintenance. Students with permits park in the east parking lot. Buses will be dropping off students at the east (Commons) entrance. We would ask that parents drop their students off at the Bell Tower entrance. (A reminder that the gate at the JJ entrance is closed from 3:00-3:30 PM.)

FVL teachers will make phone contact with the parents of all freshmen to set up home visits during early August. You will receive an information packet and have the opportunity to get your questions answered. These visits are intended to assist the students with their transition to high school. This teacher will also serve as the student's mentor during his/her years at FVL.

Dress Code

The Dress Code printed in this issue of the *Fox Tracks* is the result of the committee's work. The dress code has been reviewed by the FVL administration, faculty and the Student Services Committee and approved by the FVL Board of Regents.

Parents, please remember that enforcement starts and ends with you. Become familiar with the revised FVL Dress Code. If your child is in violation of the dress code, the violation will be corrected immediately. This may impact you, as you might have to bring different clothes to fix the violation. Time and distance might be a problem, which is why parents need to be proactive. Teachers will be reminded at the August in-service to strive to consistently deal with violations.

NCAA Eligibility

Docufide -Ordering Transcripts for College Goes Online

FVL's system for sending transcripts is online. FVL has joined forces with Docufide to bring you *Secure Transcript*TM —the safe, paperless way to send transcripts directly to the colleges you choose. It's easy, it's secure, and it's available 24/7.

Official transcripts checked and approved by the Guidance office are sent to the colleges and scholarship funds you choose. You'll receive an email confirming that they've gone out **and** when colleges receive them. *Secure Transcript*TM makes applying to college a little easier – for FVL, for your colleges, and for you!

Sign up - Find the *Secure Transcript*TM link on the FVL website home page, tell us who you are, and choose a password. You'll need an active email address other than your FVL student email so you can communicate with *Docufide* after you graduate from FVL.

Choose - Select the colleges you're applying to (we've got the addresses).

Sign off - Pay online. There's a small fee per transcript.

FVL 2011 -2012 Dress Code

Since Christian love and respect should be reflected in all that we say and do, FVL faculty and students are expected to dress in a God-pleasing manner. Modesty, good taste, cleanliness and neatness must be important factors to consider when getting ready for school. Modesty and good taste refer to avoiding such things as inappropriate T-shirts, extremes in hair style, and short skirts. Cleanliness and neatness refer to your general appearance and the condition of your clothes which should not be worn-out, torn, or dirty.

The dress code is in effect as soon as students enter the school until their departure, or when a student is representing the school in any activity. Failure to comply with any of the items in the dress code may cause a student to be sent home from school to remedy the situation. Any dress code violation turned in to the Assistant Principal will result in a detention. For the sake of order, when there are differences of opinion concerning dress, the judgment of the FVL faculty and administration will be respected.

Because fashion often changes, the dress code may also change during the school year. Updates to the dress code are noted by bold print.

The following are NOT PERMITTED for boys or girls at FVL

- Torn, worn-out or dirty clothing
- Flip-flops — this includes sport sandals such as Adidas, Nike, etc.
- Slippers
- PJ pants, sweat pants, and wind pants — sports teams may NOT wear these pants during the school day
- Spandex undergarments worn as outer garments
- Sleeveless shirts or tank tops without a shirt worn over them — all outer shirts must have sleeves of two inches past shoulder seam
- Visible tattoos
- Visible body piercing, extenders or gauging — **no band-aids over piercing**
- Unnatural hair coloring or extremes in hair style
- Hats, caps, headscarves, hoods, or other head gear may not be worn
- Low-hanging pants — pants must be worn on the hip
- Visible underwear
- Outerwear jackets may not be worn in school during normal school days — exceptions will be made for extremely cold days
- Shorts may not be worn during any months except August, September and May — cut-off shorts or sports shorts are NOT allowed
- **Students may wear clothing with selective logos and slogans. This also pertains to backpacks, gym bags and other school-related material. However, any type of logo or slogan that endorses attitudes and actions that displease our Lord are not to be worn. These would include logos and slogans referencing: beer, alcohol, drugs, double meaning, vulgar language, professional wrestling, and music (individuals, groups, concerts, album covers, etc) except those associated with FVLHS or WELS musical programs.**
- **Any other item of apparel which is inconsistent with the structured atmosphere of the school**

The following are NOT PERMITTED for boys at FVL

- Dangling/hoop earrings, more than one earring per ear lobe
- **Skinny jeans**
- Ponytails
- **Facial hair — senior boys may have a well trimmed moustache, goatee, or beard upon approval from the Administration**

The following are NOT PERMITTED for girls at FVL

- Tops that are too short, too low, or too tight
- **Tank tops or camisoles worn under a top must lie flat on their chest, with no cleavage showing**
- Shirts, sweaters, dresses, etc. that are tight-fitting or low-cut in front or back
- Halter tops or shrugs
- See-through or sheer tops
- Bare midriffs or backs — shirts must be long enough to be tucked in and stay tucked in to cover midriffs in the front and back while standing or sitting
- **Skirts and shorts should be no higher than three inches above the kneecap**
- **Yoga pants/leggings may be worn with an appropriate length skirt, but may NOT be worn alone as pants**

The following are allowed for boys or girls at FVL

- T-shirts with FVL name and/or logo, team names and/or logos, clothing brand names and/or logos
- Shirts with slogans that clearly promote Christianity

Consequences

Any violation of the dress code will result in one detention. Also, the student will have to change, and/or fix the violation immediately. If the violation cannot be immediately fixed, their parents will have to bring a change of clothes to school or pick up their child to fix the violation.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. **Fox Valley Lutheran High School** offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$2.00-\$2.50; lunch costs \$3.00-\$4.00. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch.

1. **DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD?** No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. *Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household.* We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: **Food Service Program, Fox Valley Lutheran High School, 5300 N. Meade St., Appleton, WI 54913.**
2. **WHO CAN GET FREE MEALS?** All children in households receiving benefits from FoodShare, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPPIR) or W-2 Cash Benefits, can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.
3. **WHO CAN GET REDUCED PRICE MEALS?** Your children can get low cost meals if your household income is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines, shown on this application.
4. **I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS?** Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out an application.
5. **IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER?** Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.

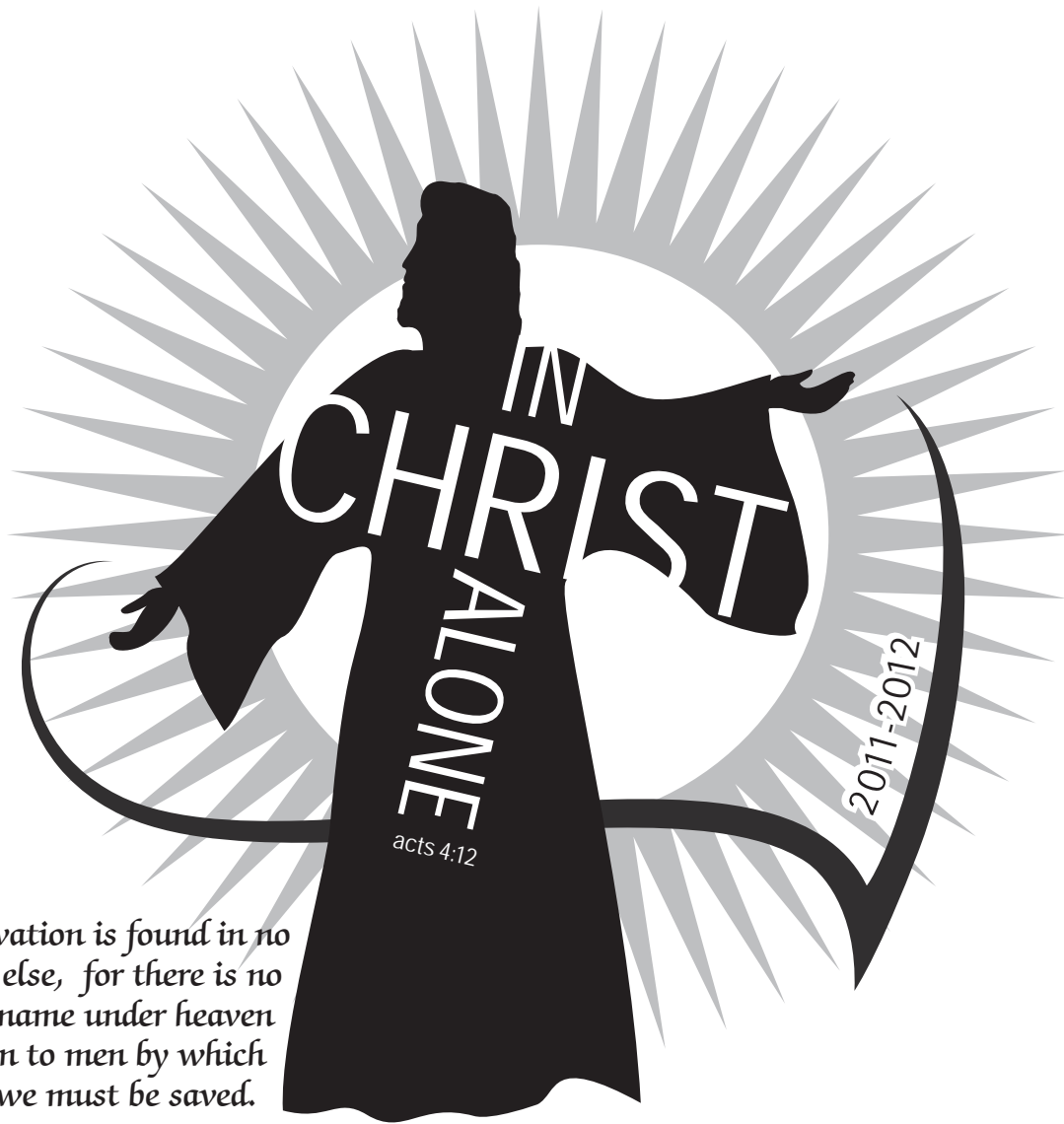
